



The **Cheers! Trail** is the only trail in North Carolina that showcases five different types of craft beverages: **wine**, **cider**, **beer**, **mead** & **distilled spirits**. Check out each location of this ever-growing Trail.

(1) Appalachian Mountain Brewery

The award-winning brewery that began in Boone, NC and is known for being the first craft brewery to buy itself back from Anheuser-Busch chose Mills River for its first tasting room outside of their hometown. The tasting room offers 32 taps, a full menu that showcases local cuisine and ingredients.

(2) Appalachian Ridge Artisan Ciders

Enjoy European style ciders in a renovated 1940s barn in the midst of an orchard. The cider is made from traditional Henderson County apples, as well as from apple trees that have been transplanted from the Normandy region of France. Appalachian Ridge also makes pommeau, a blend of cider and apple brandy.

They produce a wide variety of wines that are grown in North Carolina's Yadkin Valley and produced in Saluda, NC, as well as offer wine slushies, hard cider and beer.

One of the nation's largest craft cidery produces a regular line of hard ciders- as well as several seasonal offerings. The state-of-the-art tasting room includes windows overlooking the production facility, a permanent food truck, cider garden and indoor and outdoor stages for regular live music. Complimentary tours are offered upon request, as staffing allows, call ahead for groups. This is a popular spot for families.

Opened in late 2023, Boodas Brewing Company is one of Hendersonville's few brew pubs that boasts its own brick-and-mortar kitchen. Hot off the heels of opening, Boodas currently offers 24 taps - all NC brews - that include both its own craft beer and guest taps. The kitchen offers a variety of flavors, everything from burgers and nachos to a charcuterie board and loaded potatoes! Something for every taste. Located in downtown Hendersonville, steps from the soon-to-open Ecusta Trail, Boodas Brewing Co has parking and a covered outdoor patio that is pet-friendly.

(6) Burning Blush Brewery

An independently owned family establishment in the heart of Mills River, Burning Blush Brewery offers a half-dozen highly crafted beers on tap. The owners, the Lanning Family, seek to offer genuine customer service and great beer, while blurring the lines between traditional and experimental beer. The indoor taproom was designed to have a Gothic atmosphere that was inspired by the works of Edgar Allen Poe, and each style of beer is accompanied by appropriate glassware in which it was meant to be served, whether a wine barrel-aged sour or a juicy IPA. Burning Blush regularly has food trucks on-site and offers a large outdoor bier garden as well. Call ahead to tour the brewing facility.

(7) Burntshirt Vineyards

Produces a large selection of quality wines that have captured many national and international awards. Wines are made from 100% estate-grown grapes at two vineyards, which are among the highest elevation vineyards on the East Coast. The tasting room is popular with indoor and outdoor seating, and often offers live music. Be sure to try the apple wine, which is crafted from local Henderson County apples.

The Cider Barn at Jeter Mountain Farm is open seasonally from mid-July through October. It serves a tasty lineup of five hard ciders produced in-house from apples grown on the 411-acre farm. Guests can purchase a pint, a flight, a tasting experience at the bar or a four-pack to go. The farm offers other activities, such as apple, berry and flower picking, hayrides, a food truck, coffee shop, farm market, and fresh cider doughnuts.

The rustic setting of the tasting room includes outdoor firepits, a food truck, gem mining, shopping, goats and a variety of birds, an outdoor adventure area for children. Located on the soon-to-open Ecusta Trail, bike rentals are available here too! The brewery is pet-friendly.

Marked Tree Vineyard, located at an elevation of 2,300 feet, right on the Eastern Continental Divide, is Flat Rock's first winery. It offers 10 wine varietals made with European vinifera and French-American hybrid grapes in a picturesque setting, surrounded by panoramic views. Grapes include Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, Grüner Veltliner, Chardonnay and Vidal Blanc. Marked Tree offers an indoor tasting room and an outdoor patio with several seating areas. Vineyard tours available on Saturdays.

This is a popular brewery for families.

Beyond beer, Oklawaha Brewing regularly offers live music, trivia nights and much more. Home to the Sunflower Kitchen, a café run by the Hendersonville Co-op that offers a variety of made-to-order burgers, sandwiches, bowls and more. Friendly, leashed dogs welcome on the outdoor patio.

A wonderful pairing of traditional wines with 30-mile vistas from an expansive open-air tasting room at 3,000 feet in elevation atop Point Lookout Mountain. Point Lookout offers 10 dry and semi-sweet wines. It also has a coffee shop on site, as well as an events pavilion with regular live music. This is a great spot to catch a sunset!

Saint Paul Mountain Vineyards was the first winery to open in Hendersonville (in 2011). The vineyards are on land that has been in the same family for nine generations. Wines reflect that rich sense of place. Guided tastings showcase award-winning wines made from 14 varietals of French vinifera grapes. Seating is available on the outdoor & covered patios, both adjacent to the vineyards, and there is regularly live music and a food truck. Be sure to check out their tubular wine tastings. Just down the street is a sister property, Appalachian Ridge Artisan Ciders, which is also on the Cheers Trail.

(19) Sawyer Springs Vineyard

Small and purposeful is the mission of Sawyer Springs. This winery is a family-run operation on land that has been farmed by the same family for six generations. Sawyer Springs produces vintages in small batches served in a rustic tasting barn. Grape varietals include: Cabernet Sauvignon, Zinfandel, Merlot, Riesling and Muscadine. There is also a selection of fruit wines made from blueberries and strawberries.

The owners emphasize the connection between the land and the beer, using ingredients grown right there on the farm in their ever-rotating lineup. The tasting experience is much like a winery; customers gather around a U-shaped bar and a bartender explains the ingredients, flavors, aromas and story behind each beer.

Souther Williams vineyard features eight acres of grapes (with additional acres planned) and an open-air tasting room. On land that's been in the same family since 1800, Souther Williams cultivates well-known varietals like Cabernet Franc, Riesling and Vidal Blanc, along with lesser-known grapes from Austria, Germany and eastern Europe. These cooler climate varietals include Blaufrankisch, Gruner Veltliner, Regent and Saperavi. Souther Williams Vineyard is only open to people age 21+.

Enjoy a taste of Bordeaux in the Blue Ridge. Stone Ashe's state-of-the-art tasting room rests on a bluff at 2,700 feet in elevation, surrounded by vineyards planted with vines cloned from Bordeaux. Stone Ashe chose the terroir of the Crest of the Blue Ridge AVA to produce wines for the world stage using classic grape varieties such as Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Merlot, Petit Verdot and Riesling. Open to guests age 21 and up.

Located at Point Lookout Vineyards, World's Edge produces 6 meads: wildflower and orange blossom, apple, raspberry, tropical fruit, chamomile, and chai tea. For the uninitiated, mead is type of wine made from honey. It was popular in American during Colonial times and offers a nice alternative to Point Lookout's wine collection.
